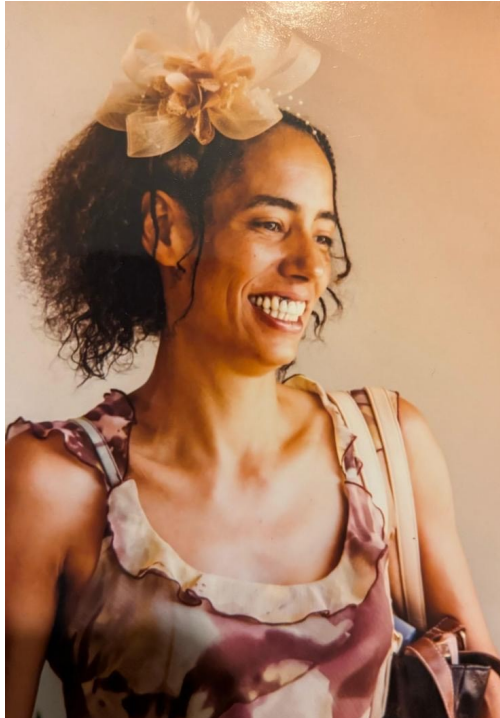

Thank you God for lives that have been lived to the full, for lives that have been poured out In love, for lives that have helped us to be what we are.

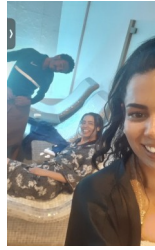
Thank you for the gift of life, for homes and for health and the love of family, all the things we take for granted.
